POSITIONS: Teachers to score the New York State English Language Arts (ELA) assessment (up to 2,745 positions)

LOCATION: Various sites throughout New York City

ELIGIBILITY: New York City Department of Education Elementary / Intermediate School licensed and appointed teachers

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- Available to score and attend training as scheduled by Scoring Site Supervisor, for the New York State English Language Arts (ELA) Assessment on selected days from April 20 – May 2, which may include after school and/or weekends.
- Teachers with English, Reading, and Social Studies licenses are preferred.
- Previous experience in scoring the ELA Assessment preferred.
- Priority will be given to NYC classroom teachers who are experienced in the New York State Standards and the format of the New York State ELA Assessment with a background in ELA performance responses and rubrics.
- Involvement in the 2012-2013 ELA instructional preparation and exam administration preferred.
- Involvement in professional development activities related to the ELA assessment preferred.
- Applicants with an unsatisfactory rating are not eligible to be selected for this activity.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Selection priorities will be determined by the Scoring Site Supervisor. Assignments to positions (either Scoring or Organizational Team) will be made at the discretion of the Scoring Site Supervisor. Preference among positions is not guaranteed.

Scoring Positions:

- *Short Response Team Members* will be responsible for the scoring of all short response questions.
- *Extended Response Team Members* will be responsible for the scoring of all extended response questions.
- *Quality Control Team Members* will move from room to room to answer questions and assure that all tests are being scored according to set protocols and at a pace that will assure the grading of all tests in a timely manner.
- *Read-Behind Team members* will be responsible for the required re-reading and re-scoring of tests as designated by NY State Education Department policy.

Organizational Team Positions:

- *Room Leaders* will be responsible for the pick-up and return of all test papers to school sites, and the distribution and collection of all test papers to individual rooms at scoring sites.
- *Administrative Support Teams* will help organize the distribution of assessment materials.
- *Grade Level Site Leaders* will be responsible for receiving of tests to be scored, the organization of sites for scoring, the secure storage of all tests overnight, and routing of all test booklets to be returned to schools.
- *Document Assurance Teams* will be responsible for moving testing materials among scoring teams and to the packaging area. They will also be responsible for the packaging of all exam materials according to Assessment Office directions.

WORK SCHEDULE: April 20 – May 2nd Up to 42 hours maximum (not guaranteed) per position including training/scoring for ELA after school and on weekends. **In order to maintain continuity and consistency of scoring, applicants must be available for the full activity in order to accept the position.**

SALARY: As per current Collective Bargaining Agreement \$41.98/hr or the most current contractual rate.

APPLICATION: An online application will be available beginning February 11, 2013. The application will be available at <https://www.nycenet.edu/offices/dhr/elamath/>. Applicants may only apply to the district in which they are employed. Applicants may be assigned to districts with scorer shortages as necessary. Applicants being considered will be notified via e-mail (subject to the completion on an OP-175 form prior to the start of the activity).

Summary of Chancellor's Regulation C-175

Chancellor's Regulation C-175 is available for review at <http://schools.nyc.gov/RulesPolicies/ChancellorsRegulations>. Each school maintains a copy of the Standard Operating Procedures Manual for Schools (SOPM). Individuals may review a copy of these procedures in order to familiarize themselves with the process by which per session employees are processed and paid.

1. All per session employees must complete an application for per session activity (OP175) prior to commencing service.
2. Individuals who have been approved for waivers in prior years must resubmit new waiver applications each year. For this purpose, the per session year is from July 1st **through** June 30th.
3. Individuals must submit a waiver form for exceeding the limit on the maximum number of hours that can be served in a per session year. The maximum number of hours of per session work that may be performed annually is available in the C-175 regulation.
4. No individual is authorized to work in a per session activity during a normal school workday.
5. Per session employment, whether funded from the same or a different source, may not be used as a means of providing additional compensation for work similar to that which is performed in an individual's primary assignment.
6. Individuals cannot serve in a per session activity for which, in their primary assignment, they are responsible for hiring, rating, or coordinating or which they normally supervise in their primary assignment.
7. No per session compensation may be paid for work performed at home.
8. Employees on sabbatical leaves beginning August 1st must complete per session activities in which they are serving in July. They will not be permitted to commence any new per session assignments until the September following the completion of the sabbatical.
9. Each per session employee is required to use a time clock to record the exact time of arrival and departure. The timecard is to be maintained at the work site and should serve as the basis of entries on the Personnel Time Report. If a time clock is not available, a daily attendance report with exact time of arrival and departure must be provided, maintained and approved by a supervisor. In every case, regardless of the specific manner in which time is reported, supervisors are accountable for verifying the record of attendance. Approval by a co-worker is not acceptable. Failure to maintain satisfactory records will result in the withholding of compensation or recoupment of payment already made.
10. Each per session employee is required to submit a time sheet for service that was performed during the prior per session period within one school day of the per session period immediately following each service.
11. ***Time sheets submitted for per session work which required a waiver that was not previously approved will result in the withholding of per session payment.***
12. If a teacher is entitled to retention rights in a per session activity but fails to claim those rights before or at the time of application for a different per session job in which the teacher has no retention rights, the teacher may then be denied employment in the job for which there is entitlement to retention.

Notes: Requests for waivers must be submitted sufficiently in advance to allow time for review and appropriate action. ***Failure to obtain a valid waiver may result in the withholding of payment for hours worked beyond the maximum hours as outlined in Chancellor's Regulation C-175.***
